DISCOVER THE PAST IN CORTLAND COUNTY



ortland County has a rich history that dates back more than 200 years. From historic homes and monuments, the wire and Brockway Truck industry, and military history, we are proud of our traditions and cultural footprint.

1890 HOUSE MUSEUM

Be prepared to be transported to 19th century Cortland at the 1890 House Museum! Built for the late 19th-century inventor and industrialist Chester Wickwire, the home is a standing time capsule illuminating the life of the wealthy Wickwire family.

The impressive limestone mansion, located in the heart of downtown Cortland, **is listed on the National Register of Historic Places.** Designed in an eclectic, Chateauesque-style, the inside of this lavish **30-room residence** showcases parquet floors, jewel-like stained glass windows, oak and cherry woodwork, and ornate decorative stenciling.

Chester Wickwire and his brother Theodore **invented a wire mesh** for window screens, wire fences and household items. As demand continued to grow for the products, the brothers **opened a large factory on South Main Street in Cortland** and became millionaires.

Wickwire products were used during the construction of the **Panama Canal** and **The Manhattan Project**—the world's first atomic bomb (which was dropped on Hiroshima in 1945)!




Today, the fully-furnished parlors and recreation rooms appear nearly untouched. The museum features restored period room settings, changing exhibitions and special programs and events.

VISIT NEW YORK STATE'S HAUNTED HISTORY TRAIL

Calling all paranormal-curious, eerie explorers and those engrossed with ghosts—the Haunted History Trail of New York State awaits you! From hotels to restaurants to a haunted asylum, the Haunted History Trail offers over 90 ghostly adventures across 400 miles within nine vacation regions of New York State. As seen on SyFy Network's *Ghost Hunters*, the **1890 House Museum** has a long history... **and ghosts!** Voices and footsteps are heard, doors open and close on their own and silhouettes of human figures appear in the windows. The unexplained ghost activity is attributed to several historical figures who lived and died within the walls of Cortland's Castle.

CNY LIVING HISTORY CENTER

A massive museum complex with a diverse collection from larger than life Brockway Trucks, including a 1925 Brockway Fire Truck that traveled back to Cortland from Argentina, to the massive collection of antique tractors, and an impressive 10,000 items collected and curated by the late Ken Eaton illustrating America's Civil War to rare items of local and national political significance.

BROCKWAY TRUCK MUSEUM

Originally founded as Brockway Carriage Works in 1875, the Brockway Motor Company played a key role in the manufacturing history of Cortland County. Examine these larger than life trucks up close, along with memorabilia and historical documents pertaining to the manufacturing of the trucks.

HOMEVILLE MUSEUM

The Homeville Museum offers American and local military and railroad history collections from the Civil War era to the present. WWII veteran Ken Eaton spent more than 35 years assembling this collection of over 10,000 items. Explore the impressive military collection that includes a M-60 Battle Tank, a nearly full size replica of a Lackawanna 2-8-2 "Mikado" Locomotive #2107, and the rich history of central New York.

TRACTORS OF YESTERYEAR

The T.O.Y.S. collection gives life to the agricultural history of Central New York and all of **rural America.** Explore the items used on farms 50 to 150 years ago, from antique tractors to plows, corn shellers to beef cutters. The collection also includes butter churns, ox yokes, flat irons, shoulder water carriers, scythes, and cradles used in old rural America.







CORTLAND COUNTY HISTORICAL SOCIETY

Founded in 1925, the Cortland County Historical Society collects, preserves, and interprets artifacts and documents representative of Cortland County's history.

SUGGETT HOUSE MUSEUM

Home to exhibits related to Cortland County, visitors have an opportunity to see the items that have shaped our history over the last 200 years. From Brockway Trucking Company to Wickwire Brothers, the businesses, industries and people of Cortland County are reflected in their collection and exhibits.

KELLOGG MEMORIAL RESEARCH CENTER

The Kellogg Memorial Research Center serves as a repository for information related to the history of Cortland County. The Collection includes maps, censuses, city and county directories, cemetery records, genealogies, histories, vital records, surname files, military records, photographic files, scrapbooks, newspapers, and more.

CORTLAND RURAL CEMETERY

Established in 1853, this open-air museum is a beautiful 19th-century Victorian garden cemetery that sits on 50 acres and is the final resting place for 18,000 people.

fine example of the rural cemetery (as a solution to the problem of overcrowding urban cemeteries), the Cortland Rural Cemetery is a carefully-planned garden cemetery with a deliberate focus on architectural and landscape design. Walk the cemetery with an interactive "cemetrail tour" and admire the beauty of the headstones and the diverse species of trees to discover those who helped shaped Cortland history.

Visitors may see the graves of the last Upstate Governor of New York, Nathan Miller; the graves of veterans of all American wars, including that of Brigadier-General Joseph Reynolds, who served in the War of 1812 and Colonel Andrew J. Grover, who died at Gettysburg; and the grave of Dr. Julia Spalding, who arrived in Cortland in 1883 as one of the nation's earliest women doctors.

FUN LOCAL HISTORY FACTS



Amelia Jenks Bloomer, a pioneer in women's rights and the temperance movement, was born in Homer, NY. She popularized women's apparel that came to be known as "bloomers."



Francis B. Carpenter, painter of Lincoln's portrait, Willian Osborn Stoddard, Lincoln's private secretary, and Eli Devoe, foiler of an assassination plot, all hailed from Homer, NY.



The Lamont Memorial Free Library was the former home of **Daniel Lamont**, the Secretary of War during one of Grover Cleveland's presidential terms.



Truxton, NY was the home of John McGraw, a 30-year manager of the New York Giants. He was inducted into the Hall-of-Fame in 1937 after compiling 2,763 victories and leading the Giants to 10 National League pennants and three World Series titles.

CORTLAND REPERTORY THEATRE

ortland Repertory Theatre is one of New York State's longest running professional theatres, producing shows guaranteed to make you laugh, cry, or hum up the aisles.

The Theatre's summer home is in the charming, turn-of-the-century **Little York Pavilion at Dwyer Memorial Park** in Preble. From June through September, the theatre produces classic musicals and cutting-edge plays, along with children's show.

CRT's winter location, and year-round administration and box office, is "CRT Downtown", located in a former bowling alley in Downtown Cortland. The venue hosts a wide variety of events, including comedy nights, concerts, cabaret nights, community dances, and proms along with CRT produced plays and original productions.



THE CENTER FOR THE ARTS OF HOMER



Since its founding in 2005, the Center for the Arts of Homer has become one of the most prolific performing arts venues in Central New York.

The 140-year-old former Baptist church plays host to a diverse series main stage programs, while also housing a series of studios used for sic and dance lessons, rehearsal spaces and an art gallery displaying work from local and regional artists.

The building's aesthetic has remained largely untouched from its church days. Stained glass windows line the walls and a former choir loft serves as a balcony. The altar was replaced with **a small stage in the 400-seat Whiting Theatre**, and has seen many renowned global, national, regional, and local acts,

including: Richie Havens, Butch Trucks, Rusted Root, Judy Collins, Arlo Guthrie, Tim Reynolds & TR3, Graham Nash, Leon Russell, Colin Hay, SpyroGyra, David Sedaris, Hot Tuna, and other notable, emerging artists.



All shows are general admission and patrons are invited to save their seat with a Post-It note. The Center serves food and beverages in the lobby prior to events.





now-covered peaks. Cozy fireplaces. Warmly-dressed skiers hitting the slopes. These are the images that typically come to mind when one thinks of a classic mountain resort. At Greek Peak Mountain Resort, there is no "off season." Situated on more than 7,000 acres of state-protected forests in Virgil, just minutes from Interstate I-81, and 10 minutes south of Downtown Cortland, the resort packs a big, family-friendly adventure.

CORTLAND COUNTY'S WINTER WONDERLAND

Central and Upstate New York's largest ski resort was founded in 1958 and offers day and night skiing seven days a week from late December until mid March. The mountain sports 56 trails, six aerial lifts, two surface lifts, and terrain parks. Some recent additions to the facility include a new quad chairlift, new ski and board equipment in the rental shop, and state-of-the art ski and board tuning facility. Greek Peak also has a great beginner area and offers lessons for all ages and every level of skier and boarder.



The Greek Peak Nordic Center boasts over 15 miles of gorgeous trails that are open to cross country skiers and snowshoers of all abilities. And, the ten-lane snow-tubing center has a lift to get you back to the top of the hill!

EXPERIENCE GREEK PEAK ALL YEAR-ROUND



The Nor'Easter Mountain Coaster is a state-of-the-art gravitational hybrid of an alpine slide and a roller coaster. Fly through the air on four dual zip lines, or test your strength, endurance and balance on the Team Challenge Ropes Course. 





HOLLENBECK'S

f your fall traditions include wandering through corn mazes, carving jack-o'-lanterns, tailgating, and everything pumpkin spice, you're in good company. Traditions like these become rich with meaning when returned to year after year, and families and friends in Cortland County have one fall tradition that has lived on since 1933: watching apples getting squeezed to create cider at Hollenbeck's Cider Mill.



Q&A WITH MATT HOLLENBECK

Matt Hollenbeck makes cider the same way his predecessor and cousin, Bruce Hollenbeck, made the famous American harvest-time drink—while adding his own personal touch for future generations to enjoy.

Q: Matt, how did you find your way to Hollenbeck's Cider Mill?

A: When I came to Bruce, the intention was to learn about small business ownership because I intended to start a guided bike-touring company. His succession plan fell through around that time, and I suddenly got the oppor-

tunity to do all these things I dreamt of doing as a child. I got to fulfill all those goals and things that I needed out of life and work to be satisfied - manual labor, doing different things every day and interacting with people.

Q: What's your favorite part about working at the Cider Mill?

A: One of my favorite things is the fact that I'm doing different things in different seasons. I'm not eating the same things. I'm not doing the same tasks. It gets you in rhythm to the passage of time, which sometimes it feels we've tried to remove ourselves from in certain ways.

Q: What is a new product you're most excited to debut?

A: There are fun, tasty products that we used to make with apples that got lost to time for various reasons. A new product that we'll be testing out is boiled cider which is basically "cider syrup." I have only been able to find two places in the entire United States that makes boiled cider, and they've started making it only the last five years. It's still a relatively uncommon product that I find incredibly delicious. It's a way to preserve the bounty of apples all year long.

Q: How important is it to maintain the tradition that your predecessors built?

A: Coming to get the products from us, that's the tradition that matters most. There's always a little kid hanging on the chain that overlooks the press, and you can hear his parents tell them that *when I was your age, your grandparents bought me here to watch this.* There's not a lot of places where you can go and see your treats being made. You're watching the whole process, there's no magic. The simplicity is what makes it so good.

Q: What's your favorite apple?

A: Early-season Macs for eating and for cider are just perfect. Northern Spies are a great one as well. Mac for a two week period early in the fall, and the rest of the time Northern Spy!

Cortland County has joined nearly every other county in New York State in its passion for brewing with local hops and grains—from farm breweries, to dragon-inspired distilleries, to wine tasting-rooms.

LOCALLY POURED: NEW BREWERY Coming to cortland county in 2020



The town of Homer will soon welcome its first craft brewery!

Homer Hops Brewing, located roughly five miles outside of downtown Cortland, is set to open in the spring of 2020, giving craft-beer locals a place to enjoy a beverage made by their own neighbors. The brewery's story began in 2015, when co-owner Jason Kristof first started home-brewing with a kit given to him by his wife. "All but one of the beers were a success," Kristof recollected. "I made a chocolate peanut butter porter once, and it was gross."

Home brewing took a backseat when Kristof and his siblings planted hops on the property used for his small-batch beer creations. "Unfortunately, my day job got really busy and I was never home long enough to brew," he added. "I thought hops would be easy because they were seasonal, but man, was I wrong."

The switch was flipped on for good though when Jason's friend Shawn Potts expressed interest in the beermaking process. "Jason said he wanted me to brew beer for him, and I said I wanted to be a partner if he was planning to open a brewery," said Shawn.

After making sure it wasn't the beer talking the following day, Potts and Kristof joined forces, and roped in help from family and friends—Jason's wife Dina, Shawn's wife Beth, Jason's brothers Tony and Wally, Tony's wife Katie, and family friend Steve Romer. They began pouring fresh brews for Cortland County craft beer fans to enjoy, and the process of building a real brewery began a few years later.



The team broke ground in August 2019 on the site of the Homer Hops Farm on Route 90, just west of the village of Homer. The facility will house

a brewery and taproom, and the farm's hops will continue to supply the brewing operation. The property will also feature an outdoor patio and live music. Eventually, they hope to host weddings and private events.

The small-batch, five-barrel brewhouse will brew stouts, porters, and multiple varieties of the incredibly popular IPA (including some hazy New England styles). Kristof also plans to have guest taps available to highlight beers from outside of Cortland County.

Until the new tasting room opens, you can find their "neon green hop" at Cortland County festivals, the Homer Farmers Market, and local hangouts like *BRU64* and *Red Jug Pub*. Their regular selections include the Chocolate Coffee-flavored "Sweet Mama's Java" and "Exit 12", a Pale Ale named for the exit to Homer from 1-81. If you find yourself at a *Cortland Crush* baseball game during the warmer months, you might find their seasonal blonde ale, "Summer Crush."

Homer is a great little village," Beth added. "I've lived here my whole life, and if we can do something to lift Homer even more, that's what we're hoping to do."

The Tasting & Tap Room also offers local assorted cheese and meat tasting boards to nibble on, as well as local honey, maple syrup, and other various snacks. Keep an eye on their Events Calendar as they offer weekly happenings from tastings to tap takeovers, open mic nights and yoga classes.



CORTLAND BEER COMPANY

Cortland Beer Company became the first brewery in Cortland County when it opened its doors in 2010, and has established itself as a town staple. Located in historic downtown Cortland, this farm brewery offers delicious draughts and flights, as well as kegs, growlers, and cans to-go. Enjoy Naked Lap Lager, Industrial IPA, 7 Valley Stout, Sunrise Coffee Stout (brewed with locally-roasted coffee beans) and other delicious beers.

The brewery turned to spirits in 2016 with heir own brand of vodka, whiskey and gin under the name Cortland Distilling Co. (which is housed in the same location as the brewery). Its tap room is also stocked with a variety of local New York State wines.

THE CORTLAND CORSET COMPANY BUILDING

This turn-of-the-century building was recently transformed into a creative hub for Cortland-area artists, photographers, entrepreneurs and centers of health. Built in 1872, the Cortland Building once housed a wagon company and a corset manufacturer. The Green Arch

From decades-old eateries to trendy new spots, Cortland County is home to countless incredible restaurants. While there are many restaurants you should have on your Cortland County dining bucket list, none will take you on a journey back in time quite like Green Arch. Tucked away on Elm Street in an unassuming white house, this Italian restaurant has been a Cortland favorite since it started serving patrons more than 80 years ago.

pened in 1933 by Francesca Discenza, visiting the Green Arch is like taking a step back into a previous era. You'll find the eatery's history displayed on the walls, Old Fashioneds line the original formidable bar, and bowls overflowing with pasta, just like Nana used to make, being bustled out of the kitchen.

Up until 2016, it was owned by the Discenza family, passed down to Francesca's grandson, John Michael Discenza from his father. With retirement in sight, he decided it was time to find a suitable replacement, and the only person he had in mind was familyfriend and Cortland native, Matthew Petrella.

Petrella, who owns Petrella Bros. Auto along with various other properties, was no stranger to the restaurant world. He had once owned a bar on Main Street called The Colosseum, and helped his brother, Robby, when he opened Cortland staple BRIX Pubaria.

ohn Michael was adamant that he wanted me to have it," Petrella said. "He knew that I would respect

what had happened here, what had grown here, and he knew I had the drive to continue it. I finally said 'how much?' and the rest, as we say here, is archery."

With the community's full support behind him, the Green Arch was opened with someone other than a Discenza greeting customers at the host table. With the exception of a few physical modifications, it has retained its old-school feel since the transition, and the squeaky front door is no exception.

That's what generations of devoted patrons expect from the Cortland City landmark. The vintage marquee sign hanging over the entrance. Photo collages of longtime customers on the walls. Partitioned leather booths in the dining room filled with hungry families. An atmosphere so friendly, it's not unusual to hear customers converse across the room about the evening's specials. And if it seems like the famous "Arch" sauce tastes the same, it's because John Michael still makes it every Sunday.

"Everything in this building has a story behind it, and you don't change that."

From Thursday through Saturday guests can expect time to stand still for those few hours they spend indulging not only in a heaping plate of Classic Arch Lasagna, but in the stories of those who have been coming to the restaurant since the 40s. In a world



where everything is so fast paced, it's a breath of fresh air to be transported down memory lane, even if it's not your own.

"I could be so tired that I can't even feel my hands, but then I get a gentleman who comes over and tells me this is the best experience of his life. I had a woman from Connecticut walk through

our front door and she started crying because the booth where she met her husband 72 years ago was still here. That stuff right there...makes it worth it."

No matter how long his name appears on the deed, Petrella knows the Discenza family will always own a piece of the restaurant and the memories that have been created there.

"I'm not doing this for me. I'm doing it for John Michael and his family, I'm carrying a baton that I was handed. What he and his family did here was amazing. We're going to be 100 years old in 14 years. It's very humbling."

So when you're walking down Elm Street and pass an unassuming white house with a neon marquee sign glowing above the door, stop and give it a look. It's not just a restaurant. It's a first date. A family legacy. A cherished memory.

It's an institution. It's the Arch.






